The people of Duval Roche and Cuvier welcomed us back again this summer for two weeks in early July! It was wonderful connecting with friends from our previous trips and meeting new people. This year our weeks were filled with teaching, working and playing with children of Cuvier, and developing a plan for water access in the village of Cuvier.

Twenty-seven young adults graduated from the “Enstiti Fle lavi a” with expanded knowledge on health, child development, human sexuality, and community development. It was a spirited group that learned lots and made important connections with each other.

In the afternoons we spent a few hours with about 150 children in a camp co-hosted by us and the local Baptist church. It was high energy, lots of play and song, and then a hot meal for everyone.

Evenings were spent with young adults learning English or computer skills. Always a challenge as we were often without electricity!

We are now working with the men’s leadership group to develop 3 wells for the village of Cuvier. Water for drinking and cooking is needed...more importantly agricultural wells are needed. (This year 90% of the crops were destroyed by drought.)


Dominican Women Afire

They were joined by nine Sisters who served as *Sister Companions* for the weekend; our Dominican Ancestors, Catherine of Siena (Nancy Murray -Adrian) and Antonio Montesinos (Jim Barnett – St Albert), plus Sisters who assisted with facilitation, liturgy, translation, and technology and a professional graphic recorder. 
Unaccompanied Minors Collection Drive
