## **Regional Suggestions:**

- Make DVD available; tweak Theological reflection and Action section for use with younger generation and general public. Use as ongoing education, faith formation and in curriculum.
- ❖ Water need greater awareness of critical future shortages and present issues
- Highlight recent weather changes to educate people on effects of climate change
- ❖ More education on our dependency on oil e.g., plastics; clothing
- ❖ Use Communications person to inform the public of what Sparkill OPs are doing to cherish and preserve creation.
- ❖ Be more aware of organizations that work to preserve our water, etc. on the local level, and actively support these organizations.
- ❖ Make DVD available and publicize our stances
- Investigate the "Adopt-A-Highway" program regarding its efficacy and how it works
- Commit to using cloth bags vs. plastic
- **❖** Explore the most efficient ways to conserve electricity and water
- ❖ Keep the issue of climate change before our Congregations. The more we are involved in decisions to act, the greater the impact.
- Support and participate in organizations that are working to mitigate the effects of global climate change.
- ❖ Make DVD available to our networks, sponsored ministries, etc...
- ❖ Keep educating ourselves, and others; especially on issues in New York State: fracking; dangerous fuel transport; water; organic foods
- Support the organic movement and look at suppliers for our Motherhouses and ministries.
- ❖ How do we link with other people/groups to respond to needs? We need to re-vision our mission and our relationships. We need to be "on the margins," but still relevant in relationship with the Church.
