Last month I had the privilege of attending the McGreal Center Board Meeting as one of its members. Under the fine direction of Janet Welsh, OP, and the superb facilitation of Judy Jewison, OP, fourteen of us gathered at Dominican University to look at where McGreal Center has been and where it can go.

I found myself wondering how many of our Sisters and Associates even know about McGreal Center. So...here is a bit briefly:

The Mission of McGreal Center for Dominican Historical Studies promotes the research and writing of the history of the Dominican Family in the United States. Through the collection and preservation of historical documents, the McGreal facilitates opportunities for scholarly research relative to the Dominican Family's significance in the Order of Preacher, the church and the nation.succeeded

This center, founded by Sr. Mary Nona McGreal, OP (died 2012) and ably succeeded by Janet Welsh, OP, has its early roots in Project Opus begun in 1985 and has evolved into a center located at Dominican University in River Forest, Illinois. There one can find archives filled with wonderful historical documents that tell the story of the Dominican Family in the United States.


Thank you to each one of you for all you have done and been during these three years. I have been blessed by you.
