Sharon is the Director of Jubilee Farm, her congregation's 111-acre center for ecology and spirituality, which lies just west of Springfield, IL. In October of 2008 she joined 139 others for training by Al Gore to present his award winning *An Inconvenient Truth* from a faith-based perspective.

She writes, lectures, gives workshops, days of reflections, and week retreats, traveling within the U.S. and outside the country. She speaks on any number of ecological topics, but her passion is sharing the Universe Story and its implications for life and faith.

Collaborative Corner From JOLT to CA-CCRI

The Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose and San Rafael collaborate in the San Francisco Bay Area with three other congregations (Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary, Sisters of Redwood City, and Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange) in Socially Responsible Investing. Originally the group was larger (14 congregations) and known as JOLT (Justice Organizers, Leadership, & Treasurers).

As membership declined, these five congregations reenergized and recreated themselves in late 2013 as CA-CCRI (California Catholic Congregations for Responsible Investing). This year they have been diligently working on communicating with major corporations, such as Chevron, Exxon-Mobil, Wells Fargo and Safeway, to pressure management regarding sustainable practices that improve their environmental and social impacts. This includes work against fracking, water pollution, greenhouse gas emissions, child labor and human trafficking.

These are all familiar and important issues to us, as we learned when we shared together at our Area Meetings this year. We will continue to find ways to move forward as we listen to what Earth is asking of us.
