Dominican Sister of Caldwell, Ann Murtha died on December 5, 2017 after a long illness. Ann died among her sisters at St. Catherine Healthcare center.

During the sharing of memories, which followed Office for the Dead, Sisters, family and friends recalled Ann's love of music and dance and of all things Irish. They recalled Ann's generous spirit and her years of ministry in education and pastoral work. Mass the next day ended with a standing ovation for a life well lived.

Dominican Sister of Sinsinawa Brideen Fohey, OP



Sister Brideen, Fohey, OP, died Dec. 18, 2017. The funeral Mass is at the Dominican motherhouse, Sinsinawa, Dec. 21, 2017, followed by burial in the Motherhouse Cemetery.

Sister Brideen made her first religious profession as a Sinsinawa Dominican Oct. 2, 1951, and her final profession Aug. 5, 1956. She ministered in music as a teacher, organist, piano teacher, and accompanist for 50 years. Sister Brideen served as a hospital chaplain for 17 years, a pastoral associate for two years, a liturgist for two years, support staff for one year and nurse aide for one year. Many of her ministries were simultaneous. She served in Illinois, Wyoming, Minnesota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, Iowa, Nebraska, New Mexico, and Canada.

Dominican Sister of Sinsinawa Mary Clemente Davlin, OP

Sister Mary Clemente Davlin, OP, died Dec. 19, 2017.

The funeral Mass will be held at the Dominican motherhouse, Sinsinawa, Dec. 28, 2017, followed by burial in the Motherhouse Cemetery.

Sister Mary Clemente made her first religious profession as a Sinsinawa Dominican Aug. 5, 1956, and her final profession Aug. 5, 1959. She taught



English for 50 years and was a prolific writer. Sister Mary Clemente is the author of *A Game of Heuene: Word Play and the Meaning of Piers Plowman B*, *The Place of God in Piers Plowman and Medieval Art*, and *A Journey into Love: Meditating with Piers Plowman*. Besides her scholarly contributions, she was perhaps best known as a devoted, caring teacher/mentor who touched thousands of lives during the course of her life. Sister Mary Clemente's love of music focused on the violin, an instrument she treasured. She served in Wisconsin and Illinois.
