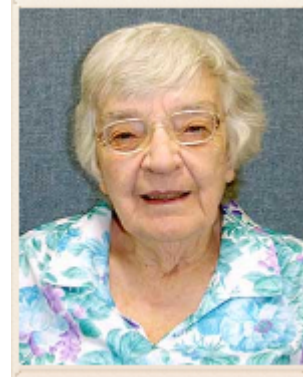


In Memoriam

Dominican Sister of Amityville Regis Milhaven, OP

Our Sister, Regis Milhaven, was called home to God on the morning of March 17, 2018. Sister was 87 years old and had dedicated 69 years to life as a Dominican Sister of Amityville.



The first thirty years of her ministry were devoted to education. At Holy Spirit School in New Hyde Park, Regis taught elementary grades. In 1960, she was assigned to St. Agnes, College Point, where she taught physics and chemistry and was department chairperson. Regis received both her BS and MS degrees from St. John's University and a Ph.D. from Fordham University. It was in 1969 that she began teaching at Molloy College, Rockville Centre where she earned the rank of Professor. Regis also taught at Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn.

Dominican Sister of Sinsinawa Christina Cegelske, OP

Sister Christina Cegelske, OP, died March 7, 2018. Prior to entering the Sinsinawa Dominican Congregation, Madeline Jean Cegelske served in the U.S. Navy, 1944–1946. She was a nurse at the U.S. National Naval Hospital, Bethesda, MD, and at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Norman, OK. Madeline obtained the rank of Pharmacist Mate, Second Class. Professed with the Sinsinawa Dominicans in 1949, she taught in the following schools: St. Thomas, Peoria Heights, IL; St. Thomas Aquinas, Milwaukee; Edgewood Campus, Madison, WI; and Annunciation, Minneapolis. Sr. Christina ministered as a family caregiver in Fairmont, MN, and served as director



and teacher at Annunciation Latch Key Program,
Minneapolis. She volunteered at Bethlehem Convent,
Faribault, MN; Annunciation School, Minneapolis;
and in the Archives at the Motherhouse, Sinsinawa.
