## Dominican Sister of Adrian Betty Jenkins, OP

Betty Jenkins was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1931. One of six children, she entered the Adrian Dominican Congregation in 1949 and at her reception received the name Sister Mary Mathia. She graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English from Siena Heights College (now University) and a Master of Arts degree in English from the University of Detroit Mercy. Betty was also certified in social work and pastoral ministry.



Betty's ministries were varied and all in the state of Michigan. She was a teacher, pastoral minister, member of the Activities Department at Maria Hall (now Dominican Life Center) in Adrian and teacher at the Siena Literary Center in Detroit, Michigan. Betty loved people and was a great listener. Although short in stature, she had a clear and pleasant voice, and frequently did a reading at Liturgy.

About a month before her death, the doctor told her that a fast-growing cancer would number her remaining days. Betty set out to plan her wake service and funeral. She recorded a reading of a favorite poem (in her own voice) to be read at the Vigil Service. The Lord took her to Eternal Life in less than the three months allotted, but Betty was ready. She died at the Dominican Life Center on May 25, 2018

## Dominican Sister of Sinsinawa Mary O'Donnell (Mary Colum), OP

Sister Mary O'Donnell, OP, died June 6, 2018. Her religious name was Sister Mary Colum. The funeral Mass was held at the Dominican motherhouse, Sinsinawa, June 12, 2018, followed by burial in the Motherhouse Cemetery.

Sister Mary made her first religious profession as a Sinsinawa Dominican Aug. 5, 1956, and her final profession Aug. 5, 1959. She taught math and physics for 56 years, serving in a high school and colleges. Sister Mary ministered in Nebraska, Illinois, Michigan and Mississippi.
