Dominican Sister of Adrian Rose Celeste O'Connell, OP

Mary Ann O'Connell was born in Chicago, IL in 1939, the eldest of 2 siblings. She graduated from St. Joseph Academy in Adrian, MI and entered the Adrian Dominican Sisters in 1955. When she received the habit, she also received the name Sister Rose Celeste. She was awarded a BA in Fine Arts and a MS degree in Guidance both from Barry College (University) in Miami, Florida.



Rose was a gifted woman who willingly shared those gifts. She was teacher and principal at several schools; was certified in Guidance and Counseling, Substance Abuse Ministry, Clinical Pastoral Education and was a Certified Associate Addictions Professional; was wonderfully talented in art. She also directed an annual Women's Serenity Retreat. Rose was a veritable repository of information, having served as Secretary of the Congregation for 26 years, working with several General Councils as well as the Dominican Leadership Conference and Dominican Sisters Conference on several Committees. In 2016, she became Director of the Office of Information.

After a diagnosis of bone cancer, Rose continued working while being treated. Recently, the cancer had spread and she became a resident of the Dominican Life Center. God came quietly for Rose on Thursday, May 17, 2018.
