Sister Margaret Anne Burke, OP, died at San Gabriel Mission Convent, San Gabriel, California, on Sunday, January 20. She was 73 years old and in the 53rd year of her religious profession.

Born on May 18, 1945, in Los Angeles, California, she graduated from St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Elementary School, Los Angeles, and graduated from St. Michael's High School, Los Angeles. She ministered as pastoral associate and the parish administrator at St. Patrick Parish, Rockford, IL, and volunteered teaching English as a second language and reading to people with sight impairments. Sister Patricia (Jarett) Henschel, OP, died Jan. 24, 2019. Professed in 1951, she taught in the following schools: Little Flower School at St. Mary Parish (now Mary Queen of Peace Parish), Billings, MT; Holy Rosary, Minneapolis; Annunciation, Green Bay; St. Sabina, Chicago; and St. Mary, Dixon, IL, where she also served as principal. Sr. Pat ministered as principal at St. Edmund School, Oak Park, IL, and



assistant professor of education at Rosary College (now Dominican University), River Forest, IL.

She served in educational administration as director of curriculum, staff development coordinator, and associate superintendent of Catholic schools, all for the Sacramento Diocesan Office of Education, Sacramento, CA; as secretary of education and director of faculties at Sacramento Waldorf School, Fair Oaks, CA; and as director of curriculum at Holy Family School, Citrus Heights, CA. Sr. Pat ministered as assistant prioress of St. Dominic Villa, Hazel Green, WI. May she rest in peace.
