In October of 2015 she was a panelist speaking to the encyclical *Laudato Si'* at a program with Cardinal Peter Turkson, hosted by the Catholic Conference of Ohio Bishops and the Catholic Climate Covenant. Sr. Sharon Zayac is included in the book *Green Sisters: A Spiritual Ecology* by Sarah McFarland Taylor. She writes, lectures, and gives retreats in and outside the U.S. She speaks on any number of ecological topics, but her passion is sharing the Universe Story and its implications for life and faith.

This is a contemplative small group retreat where retreatants integrate the elements of the Universe Story with their personal and communal stories.

Through contemplative time, communal prayer and demonstration. retreatants are guided in the basics of creating a simple woven cloth...weaving the threads of life experiences into a tapestry that celebrates and gives thanks for each retreatant's story.
