Dominican Sister of Adrian Dorthy Jeanne Burns, OP

Dorothy Jeanne Burns was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan in 1920 and was the youngest of a large family. At her reception into the Adrian Dominican Sisters, she was known as Sister James Marie Burns. Dorothy was involved in education for most of her life. Her last ministry was as Christian Service Coordinator at St. Alphonsus Parish in Dearborn, Michigan. In



2005, she was ready to return to Adrian and became a resident of the Dominican Life Center. Dorothy's stern countenance belied the warm heart beneath it. She died on June 16, 2019, at the Dominican Life Center at the age of 96 and in the 78th year of her religious profession as an Adrian Dominican Sister.
