Dominican Sister of Adrian Ana Feliz, OP

Ana Feliz was born in the Dominican Republic on April 27, 1932 to a poor family. She went to primary school and paid her way through high school by using her talent as a seamstress. She expressed her desire to become a sister to the Canadian Scarboro Fathers in her home town, and was referred to the



Adrian Dominican Sisters. After talking with sisters in Santo Domingo, she began her journey to becoming Sister Maria Josefina. The cultural change was difficult for Ana. She ministered in Florida, Nassau, Peru, Puerto Rico and Santo Domingo in education, and Spiritual Direction. During our Congregation gathering, Transformations '89, Ana was one of the main speakers – on Contemplation. Ana was a delightful and joyful woman, who came to the Dominican Life Center in 2010. Dominican Sister of Adrian Carol Louise Hiller, OP

Elizabeth June Hiller, born on October 11, 1921 in Detroit, Michigan, was an only child with a wealth of cousins. When she received the habit, she also received the name S. Carol Louise. Her ministry was primarily in elementary and secondary education and as a librarian. She was generous, a lover of



nature and adventurous. After open-placement, she ministered in Alaska, as a Librarian. Then, she was asked to write the life of Bishop Francis Gleeson, first Bishop of Fairbanks: *Gleeson, the Last Vicar Apostolic of All of Alaska* was published in 2004. At age 86, after Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans, Carol volunteered 6 months reorganizing the Library at St. Mary Dominican High School, staffed by the Dominican Sisters of Peace. Her sister, Therese, is also an Adrian Dominican. Sean was much beloved by the children she taught and by their parents. This June, Sean celebrated her Diamond Jubilee in Adrian. On August 4th, Sean suffered serious injuries as the result of an auto accident, and was taken to University Hospital in Ann
